FEE-FOR-SERVICE PROGRAMS

Qualifiers

- Girls and boys ages 0-18
- Living arrangements include biological homes, foster homes, adoptive homes and shelters
- Towns served by the Hartford, Manchester, and New Britain Area Offices

Services Offered

- Trauma-informed staff; “Risking Connections” training
- Peer support
- Socialization opportunities
- Supervised safe environment
- Recreation
- Transportation
- Meals and snacks

- **Trauma-Informed Peer Support Services**

- Progress summaries provided to parents and social workers
- Maximum length of service unlimited up to nineteenth birthday
- Generally about four hours per day
- **\$25 per hour**

- **Emergency Daytime Care and Other Services**

- Available for school suspensions, youth awaiting placement for living situation or school enrollment, and any other short-term or long-term service need
- Available generally from 9 AM through 7 PM (**7 AM open when set-up in advance**)
- Same day service may be available
- Infant/toddler space with age-appropriate toys and activities (diapers included)
- Daily activities tailored to meet the needs of individuals
- **\$25 per hour**
- Call Y-US Fee-for-Service Program Coordinators Jennifer Garretto xt. 111 or Krista Gale xt. 105 for special service requests

- **Transportation Services**

- Available to transport children and/or adults on a case by case basis
- Service must normally be scheduled at least 3 business days in advance; emergencies may be accommodated if driver and vehicle are available
- Normally available Monday through Friday mornings, **finishing by 2:30 PM ONLY**, Y-US holidays excluded
- **\$25 per hour plus \$0.45 cents per mile**, with a **two hour minimum**; rounded after two hours to the nearest quarter hour of service, beginning and ending at our Hartford location down the street from the Hartford DCF Area Office
- Charges will continue to accrue if driver and vehicle wait during appointment

Direct care agency staff are screened, trained or certified in the following:

- Pre-Employment Drug Test
- First Aid Certified
- Infant/Child/Adult CPR Certified
- Safe Food Handling Training
- Bloodborne Pathogens/Universal Precautions Training
- Mandated Reporting of Child Abuse/Neglect Training
- Risking Connections Model of Working With Survivors of Childhood Trauma
- On-the-Road Safe Vehicle Driving Training (Drivers Only)
